#### **September Moth News -**

Well after several months of bumper moth records, new species, migrants galore, September began on a slow-down. Weather conditions early in the month changed dramatically with rain showers and much cooler temperatures which obviously had an impact on the moth trap results.

**September 1st** - Mark Radford posted the first moth records for the month from his Staveley garden, with *Paraswammerdamia albicapitella* as the main highlight. Pete Mella from Norton Lees recorded an **Orange Sallow.** Nikki Barrow recorded a number of leaf mines from the Jim Mart NR including *Phyllonorycter rajella*, *Phyllonorycter tristrigella* and *Lyonetia clerkella*.

September 2nd - Dave Evans recorded a variety of leaf mines from Wyver Lane, including Stigmella plagicolella, Stigmella speciosa, Stigmella oxyacanthe, Stigmella nylandriela, Stigmella confusella and Stigmella salicis. Phyllonorycter geniculea and quercifoliella. Steve Orridge recorded Palpita vitrealis, Rusty Dot Pearl, Autumnal Rustic and Orange Sallow as highlights from his Buxton garden light trap. Clive Ashton ran his garden light trap at Cromford recording 70/19 including 8 Pale Mottled Willow and 30 Large Yellow Underwing. Mark Bradford and Don Cambridge trapped at Markham Vale South Tip and recorded 204/38, which included 97 Square-spot Rustic and an Oak Hook-tip as highlights. Dave Newcombe recorded 151/37 from his Belper garden light trap with Nomophila noctuella (Rush Veneer) and Ypsolopha sylvella being the main highlights.

**September 3rd** - A **Frosted Orange**, **Brown-spot Pinion** and a **Feathered Gothic** were recorded by Dave Evans at Belper, from 101/25, with a distinctive hint of autumn moths from his garden light trap. Clive Ashton at Cromford from 107/32 had 52 **Lesser Yellow Underwing**, 9 **Broad-bordered Yellow Underwing** and **Nomophila noctuella** (**Rush Veneer**) from his garden light trap.

A moth event took place at Allestree Park with Derby Natural History Society on 3rd, when 16 people attended. Although it had rained most of the day, the evening was dry and 14 moths of 8 species were recorded. Highlights were three **Brindled Green** and a **Feathered Gothic** recorded by Brian Hobby

During January 2025, The National Biodiversity Network Trust opened their 2025 Awards for Wildlife Recording. The Joint Derbyshire Moths Verification and Recording Team decided to put forward our application for the Group Award section.

**September 4th -** A **Clifden Nonpareil** was recorded from a garden at Midway - Mike Williams (iRecord)

5th September - Clive Ashton recorded Burnished Brass from 38/13 at Cromford. Nikki Barrow from Shirland also recorded Burnished Brass along with Iron Prominent and an *Ancylis badiana* as highlights from her garden light trap. Another *Palpita vitrealis* from Dave Evans Belper garden along with a Purple Bar and *Aproaerema anthyllidella* which was new for his garden.

Christine Maughan took **Oak Hook-tip, Rusty Dot Pearl,** a **Scarce Bordered Straw** and a **Vestal** from her Mickleover garden moth trap. A nice selection of migrants.

6th September - Dave Evans took *Ypsolopha sylvella* and Brindled Green from 134/39 at Belper. Emily Milnes had a Cypress Pug and *Palpita vitrealis* from her Sandiacre garden. Nikki Barrow took 33/18 at Jim Mart NR including highlights of Oak Hook-tip, Frosted Orange, *Nomophila noctuella* (Rush Veneer) and Autumnal Rustic. Clive Ashton recorded his 4th Dewick's Plusia from 52/25 at Cromford and Sam Goddard recorded a Hummingbird Hawkmoth from his Fenny Bentley garden. Pete Mella took another Cypress Pug from Norton Lees. A *Palpita vitrealis* was attract to light at a Midway garden - Mike Williams (iRecord).

**7th September -** Clive Ashton ran his actinic at Cromford Moor and recorded 6/6. **Pine Carpet** and **Autumnal Rustic** were part of a poor return.

8th September - Graham Pollock from Quarndon recorded a Rusty Dot Pearl from 36/7. Dave Evans recorded a few leaf mines from Wyver Lane including Stigmella speciosa, Stigmella crataegella, Parornix anglicella, Phyllonorycter geniculella, Stigmella salicis, Stigmella aceris, Stigmella plagicolella. and Stigmella hybnerella.

**9th September** - A stunning **Clifden Nonpareil** was recorded by David Knass from Mellor, along with a **Bulrush Wainscot** and a **Brindled Green**.

**10th September -** Andrew-John Shervill recorded 14/5 from his inner-city Derby garden including a **Magpie Moth.** Not very many have been recorded so far this year.

**10th September -** Graham Pollock recorded a **Vestal** from his garden light trap in Quarndon from 34/8. Also his first **Lunar Underwing** of the year and a **Rusty Dot Pearl**. Dave Evans recorded a **Hummingbird Hawk-moth** in his Belper garden.

12th September - Ann Wood recorded a Dark Sword-grass from Sandiacre.

**14th September** - Martin Roome found a **Tawny Pinion** in his garden at Chaddesden whilst moving garden furniture. Mary Wilde recorded 2 **Hummingbird Hawk-moth** in her Matlock garden.

**16th September** - A **Silver-striped Hawk-moth** was discovered in an East Staffordshire garden at Denstone, less than a mile or so from the Derbyshire border.

**17th September** - Clive Ashton from Cromford recorded the first **Black Rustic** of the autumn from 20/13, also **Lunar Underwing** and **Small Square-spot Rustic**. John Turner from New Mills trapped **Frosted Orange**, **Pink-barred Sallow** and 2 **Canary-shouldered Thorn** as his highlights.

18th September - Dave Evans recorded his first Black Rustic, Pink-barred Sallow, Palpita vitrealis and Acleris emargana from 110/37 at Belper. Clive Ashton recorded another Clifden Nonpareil, a Scarce-bordered Straw and Mompha locupletella from his Cromford garden light trap. A Garden Pebble from Sid Morris at Staveley was a highlight from his GMS results. John Turner recorded Frosted Orange, Black Rustic and Brown-spot Pinion from New Mills. Several more Scarce Bordered Straw from Chaddesden, Martin Roome and Chellaston from Richard Pittam.

19th September - Dave Evans took a Dark Sword-grass from his MV in Belper, and Graham Pollock recorded Deep Brown Dart and Flounced Rustic at Quarndon. Nikki Barrow from Shirland had another Deep Brown Dart and Rusty Dot Pearl, along with an out of Season Swallow-tailed Moth. Pete Mella from Norton Lees recorded Orange Sallow, Scrobipalpa ocellatella and Rusty Dot Pearl.

19th September cont'd - Another Clifden Nonpareil from Darley Bridge recorded by Stephen Moores who also had the first Merveille du Jour of the year. John Turner from New Mills had a Pale Pinion, Dark Sword-grass, Black Rustic and Rusty Dot Pearl. A Clifden Nonpareil and a Nomophila noctuella (Rush Veneer) from Littleover by Neil Ward.

In recent days three good leaf mine records have been discovered by local recorders. **Phyllonorycter spinicolella, 21st** found by Andrew-John Shervill, and **Phyllonorycter comparella** and 4 mines of **Phyllonorycter pastorella, 22nd** both found by Sam Goddard and both new species for the VC57, Sam also found **Phyllonorycter stettinensis**, All three species were discovered at Alvaston Park, Derby.

**20th September** - Dave Evans recorded a **Dark Sword-grass** from his Belper garden light trap.

**23rd September -** Andrew-John Shervill has recorded **Phyllonorycter platani** with photos of larvae and also **Phyllonorycter esperella** mine and larvae along with the mine of **Phyllonorycter joannisi**. All good leaf mine records and all recorded from Sunnyhill Park on 23rd.

Sam Goddard recorded a **Feathered Ranunculus** from Fenny Bentley, a scarce species in the county and also 20 **Lunar Underwing**. Clive Ashton had **Green Brindled Crescent** ("*f.ab capucina*") and the first **Red-line Quaker** of the year from Cromford. Sid Morris from Staveley had a **Deep Brown Dart**, **Angle Shades**, **Black Rustic**, **Bearded Chestnut**, **Lunar Underwing**, **Light Emerald** and **Red-green Carpet**,

**24th September** - Sam Goddard recorded a **Brindled Green** and a couple of late records of **Common Wainscot** and **Willow Beauty** from Fenny Bentley from 52/7, also recording 35 **Lunar Underwing**. Martin Roome recorded the first **Blair's Shoulder Knot** for the year from Chaddesden.

25th September - Sam Goddard reared an adult *Phyllonorycter pastorella* from a leaf mine he found on 22nd Sept. Mark Radford from Staveley took **Black Rustic** and **Pink-barred Sallow** as highlights from his garden light trap. Brian Hallam from Findern recorded 50/15 including **Green-brindled Crescent**, **Brindled Green**, **Angle Shades**, **Barred Sallow**, **Sallow**, **Beaded Chestnut** (6), **Centre-barred Sallow** and **Black Rustic** (4). John Turner up at New Mills recorded the stunning **Merveille du Jour** from his garden light trap.

Nikki Barrow from Shirland had 88/11 from her garden light trap, which included a **Deep Brown Dart**, **Black Rustic**, **Green-brindled Crescent** and **Beaded Chestnut**. Some very nice autumnal moths.

**September Moth News** - **26th Sept cont'd** - **Deep Brown Dart** seems to be having a good year as several more were recorded from various locations including Mickleover, by Christine Maughan, one from Matt Leedell at Belper, 2 from Dave Newcombe at Belper and one from Kirk Hallam by Brian Hobby.

Clive Ashton recorded a **Dark Sword-grass** from his Cromford garden along with a **Scrobipalpa ocellatella** from 12/8. A **Blair's Shoulder Knot** from New Mills by John Turner

**27th Sept -** Clive Ashton risked the rain at Cromford and recorded 28/18. Highlights were **Pinion-streaked Snout**, **Blair's Shoulder-knot**, **Angle Shades**, **Pale Mottled Willow** 2, **Green Brindled Crescent**, **Canary-shouldered Thorn**, **Green Carpet**, and **Red-green Carpet** 2.

**28th Sept** - A few more Leaf-miners were recorded by Mark Radford at Markham Vale and all were new site records. *Phyllonorycter coryli, Parornix anglicella* and *Stigmella catharticella*.

**29th Sept** - A **Brindled Ochre** and a **Small Autumnal Moth** were both recorded from Gnat Hole, Glossop by Christian Heintzen, both species are first records for the year. Pete Mella recorded his first garden record at Norton Lees of **Plutella porrectella**. Sid Morris ran light traps at Markham Vale recording 71/24 with highlights of **Large Wainscot**, **Autumnal Rustic**, **Red Line Quaker and** 15 **Lunar Underwing** were notable.



**30th Sept -** Andrew-John Shervill recorded the leaf mine of *Ectodemeia atricolis* at Sunnydale LNR. Matt Leedell discovered a **Merveille du Jour** on an office building on Chequers Road, Derby of all places.

Sid Morris trapped in his Staveley garden recording highlights of 5 Barred Sallow, 2 Green Brindled Crescent, 2 Red Line Quaker, Rosy Rustic and Black Rustic. Clive Ashton fired up his Cromford mv Light trap and his highlights were Feathered Thorn, Blair's Shoulder-knot, Angle Shades, Green Brindled Crescent, Red-line Quaker and a late *Archips podana*.

I ran my garden 20w Actinic in Melbourne and recorded 2 **Deep Brown Dart,** 1 **Dark Sword-grass,** 3 **Beaded Chestnut,** *Carcina quercana* and *Tachystola acroxantha* as particular highlights. Peter Stoppard record an **Orange Sallow** flying around his bathroom in Dronfield, a most unusual record!. Nikki Barrow ran a 20W actinic Heath Trap at the Jim Mart Reserve and had **Brindled Green** and *Acleris rhombana* as new species for the site. Also a **Frosted Orange** and **Red-line Quaker** as other highlights.

**Late News** - Whilst verifying records, one of the recording team discovered a new species of micro moth for VC57 Derbyshire. The leaf mine of *Phyllocnistis xenia* (Kent Maze-miner) was recorded from the Erewash Canal by Marion Bryce on 17th September 2025. The species was first discovered in Kent in 1974 and has progressively extended its range northwards.


