## December Moth News:

A very cold, wet and windy start to the month, which turned mild, but still wet, around the weekend of the 6th. Matt Leedell recorded the first moth for December when he was out walking on the evening 3rd, when using his flashlight, he picked out a **Winter Moth** in woodland off Shaw Lane, Milford.

**6th December** - Brian Hobby from Kirk Hallam ran his moth trap for his Winter Garden Moth Survey (WGMS) - 3.5°C over night and recorded just two moths, **December Moth** and **Dark Chestnut**. Also Clive Ashton ran his Cromford garden light trap for the first time in over three weeks. Six moths of three species: **Mottled Umber** 4, **December Moth**, a female and **Epiphyas postvittana** (Light-brown Apple Moth).

**December Moth News:**

**8th December** - Mark Radford recorded **The Brick** on a tree trunk at Markham Vale, North Tip.

**9th December** - Martin Roome ran a 4x6w LED moth trap at Chaddesden Wood between 18:30 - 20:45 and recorded **Chestnut**, **December Moth**, **Mottled Umber** (9), **Red-green Carpet** and **Winter Moth** (7male and 1 female).

**10th December**- Martin Roome recorded 31 **Heralds** and 11 **Peacock Butterflies** roosting in the Calke Park tramway tunnel.

**11th December**- Emily Milnes ran her first moth trap in over a month from her Sandiacre garden and for her efforts recorded 2 **Light-brown Apple Moth** and a single **Mottled Umber**.

Christine Maughan ran her garden moth trap at Mickleover managing to record a **Chestnut**, **Winter Moth** and **Light-brown Apple Moth**.

**16th December** - Bryan Barnacle recorded the third record for VC57 Derbyshire on 16th December 2025 at Froggatt of ***Carpatolechia decorella*** during daylight, as he watched it fly across his garden landing on a nearby window. After a number of tentative conversations on the ID of the moth, which does not show the usual markings of the species, it has today been confirmed by Stephen Palmer. Many thanks to Bryan for the use of his image and to Stephen for ID confirmation.

**December Moth News:**

**19th December** - Brian Hobby ran his WGMS (Winter Garden Moth Survey) at Kirk Hallam despite temperature down to 0.1°C on his weather station. He was pleased to record three moths - **Mottled Umber**, **Common Plume** and ***Ypsolopha ustella*** (**Varied Ochre**), a nice micro moth to record at this time of year.

**22nd December** - Sid Morris completed his surveys of the Monsal Tunnels for December, recording a **Tissue** from Headstone Tunnel and two each of the **Herald** from Cressbrook and Litton tunnels.

**24th December** - Mark Radford discovered the larval cases of ***Coleophora lutipennella*** on the tips of Oak buds at Markham Vale North Tip.

**27th December** - Brian Hobby ran his WGMS at Kirk Hallam and despite temperature being 5.7°C, he only recorded a single **Winter Moth** for his efforts.

**29th December** - Mark Radford produced the last moth post for 2025 with several records of larval cases from Markham Vale South Tip. Discovering numerous ***Coleophora laricella*** (13 cases in ten minutes), one larval case of ***Coleophora lutipennella*** and ***Coleophora alticolella/glaucicolella*** estimated to be in their thousands across the Juncus beds on the reserve.

**December Moth News:**

A plan is in place to present a live zoom meeting in February to cover in detail the mothing highlights of 2025, so keep an eye open for further information. In the meantime here are some snippets.

With 2025 drawn to a close, let's look back over the year's mothing highlights - There were 3 new macro moths for the recording area - **Kent Black Arches** and **Small Marbled** in June and **Cloaked Pug** in July. There were 17 new species of micro moths (includes 6 Leaf Mines) which included **Caloptilia falconipennella** and **Depressaria daucella** in March, **Ancylis upupana** in May, **Grapholita lobarzewskii** and **Argyresthia arceuthina** in June, **Monochroa cytisella**, **Dichomeris alacella** and **Phyllonorycter joannisi** in July, **Evergestis extimalis** and **Zimmermannia atrifrontella** in August and **Nephoterix angustella** in September.

2025 was truly a good year for micro moths and one of the best in recent times. Two moth reports have been completed this year - The 2024 report covering Derbyshire Macro Moths, which was published in the DaNES Journal No: 174 and a copy can be downloaded here if you are not a member of DaNES :-
